## Message from the Prioress

Dear Friends,

This issue of our quarterly newsletter is filled with many stories of our life in Benedictine community - at our monastery, in our infirmary, and in our various ministries. We hope you enjoy the stories. The accompanying photos, one might say, are the modern day way of telling a story!

Wintertime seems like a great season to talk about storytelling! As a people, we gather around the fire, we sit around feast day tables, and, together, we find comfort from the chill of the season in the warmth of our own homes. Much of our time is spent sharing our stories. Storytelling is an ancient practice that allows people to come together to share wisdom of the past, experiences of the present, and hopes for the future. Storytelling helps us preserve our communal memory, provides understanding from whence we have come, and gives us a glimpse of where we might be going. Many religions use stories to teach. Our own is no exception. Our scriptures are rich with marvelous stories and parables. Our children (and we) learn about life through these tales. Edward Hays describes the power of stories by saying: "Stories and parables never grow old or lose their magic, magnetic power because they are of the soul."

Benedictine history was first recorded through this ancient art of stories in the "Dialogues of St. Gregory." One of my favorite stories is depicted in our chapel. Benedict and Scholastica are shown in the days immediately preceding her death. As was their custom they met to talk (with companions, of course). As the tale goes, Scholastica wanted to spend more time with her brother and pleaded with him to stay. He, as any good monk, insisted that he needed to return to his monastery. She put her head down to pray. Before long, a ferocious thunderstorm was heard and felt. Needless to say, Benedict stayed much longer saying, "What have you done, sister?" Scholastica told him that she had asked him to stay and when he refused, she had asked God. God (and Scholastica) prevailed!

Bartlett's Book of Quotations, 1907 describes the phenomenon of "storytelling" by stating that "it reveals meaning without committing the error of defining it." That is the wonder of the art of storytelling. We can convey the meaning of our lives without limiting ourselves to definitions. You will find a few stories and comments from our readers in this issue. We invite you to continue to share your stories with us and we promise to share ours with you.

## In Loving Memory

Sister Celine Beck, O.S.B. died peacefully on October 27, 2007, after several weeks of illness. Kathryn Mary Beck was born in Cañon City, Colorado, on July 5, 1924, the daughter of Joseph Edward and Jennie Agnes Stock Beck. She attended Saint Scholastica Academy in Cañon City, Colorado, graduating in 1943. On September 16, 1945, she entered St. Scholastica Monastery. When Kathryn completed her postulancy, she was received into the novitiate on July 11, 1946. At that time, she was given the religious name of Sister Celine. On July 26, 1947, she professed triennial vows and her perpetual vows on that same date in 1950.

Sister Celine served as a primary grade teacher at St. Hilary Parish, St. Symphorosa Parish, St. Leander Parish (Pueblo, CO), Queen of All Saints Parish, St. Mary Parish (Pueblo, CO) and St. Joseph Parish (Salida, CO).

Experiencing ill health which eventually resulted in major heart surgery, Sister Celine retired from teaching in 1968. She moved to St. Scholastica Academy in Cañon City, where she was able to assist her sister, Margaret, with their mother's care during her last illness. In addition, she became receptionist and switchboard operator at the Academy.

When asked to serve as the Academy's archivist, she worked hard to see that there were print and photographic records of the many treasured artifacts that were part of the school's century long history. Despite failing eyesight she took interesting pictures of people at the Academy, activities, special events, buildings and grounds. When the school closed in 2001, she was able to share very many interesting facts and anecdotes about people, places and things.

Sister Celine retired in January 2004, and returned to Chicago. Eager to remain abreast of news and serious about her spiritual life, she filled her hours listening to tapes and "talking books".

On July 11, 2007, Sister Celine renewed her vows on the occasion of her Diamond Jubilee.

Sister Celine's was the very first funeral in the new St. Michael's church in Colorado. She is survived by her brother, Thomas Beck, and two nephews, George Austin and Daniel Austin, sons of her sister, the late Margaret Beck Austin, and by her Benedictine Sisters.

## New Oblate Chapter To Begin

The Benedictine Sisters of Chicago are beginning a St. Scholastica Academy chapter of their already active Oblate program. Currently St. Scholastica Monastery has 69 Oblates. Oblates are Catholics and non-Catholics, men and women, people seeking to deepen their personal spirituality and enrich the world with the tradition they have come to know and value. Anyone associated with the Academy is well aware of the Benedictine spirit which pervaded every aspect of the school community. The new chapter of Oblates will be open to alumnae, parents, faculty, staff, donors and friends of the Academy who would like to participate in a formal way in the life of the community which sponsors SSA.

What will this new Oblate chapter look like?

~Those who live nearby may choose to attend meetings held monthly on a week night and/or participate in liturgy at the Monastery.

~Those living out of town, through technology and other communication, will have opportunities to actively participate in the Oblate program.

~Men and women who sign up to be Oblates will continue to live out their lives in the same times and places where they are currently committed as lay persons.

~Oblates are committed to the mission of St. Scholastica Monastery with an intent to continue to grow in their spiritual life and in the service of others by prayerful reflection on God's word in Scripture and other readings in the spirit of Saint Benedict.

~They will spend time exploring what this journey means for them and determining how they can participate in the life of this community whose spirit they choose as their own.



Interested people will have a period of time after they enroll, usually a year, to reflect on whether the Oblate program is a helpful guide as they travel through their lives. If their answer is "yes," they will make an Act of Oblation, in the presence of the Monastery community, and

become formally affiliated with the Oblates of St. Scholastica Monastery.

## Sisters Serving "Where There Is Need"

The Benedictine Sisters of Chicago are "called to seek God in prayer and community, serving where there is need." Here are three Sisters' stories.

**Sister Jeanne Hegarty, O.S.B.** has been a teacher, a principal, a fundraiser, and worked in ministry with the elderly. Today, Sister Jeanne can be found helping out in the monastery infirmary, a natural extension of her previous ministry work. "I listen as carefully as I can to what is said or implied, and do various errands or odd jobs. It is important to trust that your visit means something even when the sick individual can't show it."

**Sister Callista Kaley, O.S.B.** can often be found at the organ or keyboard in the chapel, or directing the choir and the monastic schola. She teaches piano students, and leads the infirmary Sisters in singalongs. She loves to decorate the monastery – she certainly puts people in the right mood for every holiday! Sister Callista organizes Friday evening video gatherings in the community room, whether watching "Monk" or her favorite movie ("Rebecca".) She loves to shop, and gladly provides needed rides for the Sisters. She is one of those wonderful women who see things that need to be done and do them, without fanfare. She is an example of the love, service, and fun that makes the community the blessed group that it is.

**Sister Virginia Jung, O.S.B.** works as the Aftercare Director at Grace House, a place of respite for women who have been released from prison. She helps assess housing needs, assists in developing a housing plan, facilitates Life and Living Skills groups, oversees resident savings accounts, and matches women with volunteer mentors. Sister Virginia's favorite part of her work is listening to the women tell their stories and talk about their dreams and goals. "It is an honor to be part of their journey of personal transformation," said Sister Virginia, "and there is some Easter in each day!"
