This book is a criticism of the inadequate reforms of the Church that followed the Second Vatican Council by an author who has written about the Church from 1960 on. Such issues as abortion, homosexuality, end-of life ethics and the clerical sex scandal are individually examined and are also seen as symptoms of structural change that is needed. It offers a vision of a church organized in small communities, a structure that may not have been possible in past centuries but is both possible and necessary now.

Sister Patricia Crowley currently companions people in spiritual direction and on retreats as well as in spiritual groups through the Ignatian Spirituality Program (ISP). As the founder of Bethany House of Hospitality, she continues to work with young women who are seeking asylum in our country. She is formerly the prioress of St. Scholastica Monastery, the president of the Conference of Benedictine Prioresses, a theology teacher at St. Scholastica Academy, and a long-time administrator of not-for-profit organizations dedicated to ending homelessness for people in Chicago. She holds a Masters degree in Catechetical Theology, is a woman of prayer and is definitely "a seeker."
